Grant Objectives

The objectives of the Education Advisory Board are to promote waste prevention and recycling, job training and education through:

- Waste prevention and recycling programs that serve schools (recycling supplies, program materials and other education activities such as field trips);
- Projects in: waste prevention, source reduction, reuse, recycling, composting and procurement of recycled content products;
- We are especially interested in supporting school projects in food waste prevention, food donation, and organics separation pursuant to [Senate Bill 1383](#);
- We prioritize projects that provide a learning opportunity for students and/or the community and projects that result in high quality recovered materials and products;

Grant Objectives-part 2

- Priority will be given to programs that change the culture/behavior of waste prevention and recycling in schools;
- Community education through waste prevention, source-separation and recycling education programs;
- Job training and internships in the field of waste prevention and recycling.

Note: The Board will not fund hand dryers, water stations, battery chargers, document readers or gardening equipment.

Funding Categories

- Mini-grants-range from \$500-\$3,000 each.
- Project grants-average approximately \$20,000 each, with a maximum request of \$50,000.
 - Please note, due to lower funding levels this grant category is expected to be very competitive.
- In addition, no more than (3) applications will be considered from one applicant.

Who is eligible to apply?

- Grant money is limited to individuals and organizations serving citizens of Alameda County and the city of San Ramon, with the exception of franchise waste haulers.
- Past grant recipients have included teachers, schools, school districts, student councils, PTAs, individuals and non-profit organizations.

How are applications evaluated?

1. Does the applicant meet the Board's eligibility requirements?
2. How well does the request meet one or more objectives of the Advisory Board?
3. Are the project goals and tasks clear and concise?
4. Are the project tasks, timeline, and budget realistic?
5. Is the applicant qualified to accomplish the project?
6. Does the project leverage other public and private resources (such as foundation grants, other grant making organizations, etc.)?
7. Will the project's deliverables be useful or transferable to others?

Application Deadline

Applications must be received by:

FRIDAY, MARCH 1, 2019
